

1- THE ROTARY THEME 2017 - 2018



Rotary International President-elect Ian H.S. Riseley is a member of the Rotary Club of Sandringham, Victoria, Australia. He unveiled the 2017-18 presidential theme, Rotary: Making a Difference, to incoming district governors at Rotary's International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA. The President-elect challenged every Rotary club to make a difference by planting a tree for each of its members between the start of the Rotary year on 1 July and Earth Day on 22 April 2018. Trees remove carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases from the air, which slows global warming. The Presidentelect hopes that the result of that effort will be far greater than the environmental benefit that those 1.2 million new trees will bring. PE Riseley also urged clubs to improve their gender balance and lower the average age of their members. Only 22% of Rotary's members are women, up from 13% 10 years ago. At that rate, Riseley said, it will take another three decades for Rotary to achieve gender parity.

PE Riseley also believes it is imperative that clubs find ways to attract and engage younger members. Today only 5% of reported members are under 40, and a majority of members are over 60.

Clubs will make a difference this year through their own decisions, said PE Riseley, but it will take teamwork on a global scale to move Rotary forward and secure its future.



2- BLOOD DONATION 25 MARCH 2017

La demande de sang ne cesse d'augmenter à Maurice surtout avec l'accroissement des services hospitaliers et les interventions médicales...

Justement pour pallier à ce manque et pour venir en aide à la banque de sang, ils sont 5 Clubs du Rotary qui unissent leurs forces, soit les Clubs de Beau-Bassin/Rose-Hill, Phoenix, Ebène, Quatre-Bornes et Tamarin Les Salines...

Une initiative en collaboration avec le Ministère de la Sante et de la Qualité de la Vie.

Maurice compte environ 4,200 donneurs bénévoles soit 2,5% de la population qui fait don de leur sang régulièrement.

Deux caravanes étaient en deux endroits pour recueillir le maximum de pintes de sang soit a Rose-Hill et à Bagatelle.

Un geste noble qui permet de sauver des vies et selon L'Organisation Mondiale de la Sante, plus de 93 Millions de pintes de sang sont collectes à travers le monde.

En une seule journée, 150 pintes de sang ont été recueillies.

4- FOUR WAY JOINT MEETING


17 MARCH 2017

ROTARIAN RAJ AUCKLOO MARCH 2017

The budgetary measure on the National Skills Development Programme (NSDP) was the theme of the Rotary Club of Phoenix's meeting on 1st March 2017.

Rtn Raj Auckloo, Director of the Human Resource Development Council made a presentation on the NSDP where Government is enlisting 4,000 persons for training in technical skills that are in high demand. This will include training for 1,000 young people in each of the following sectors:

ICT, Tourism and hospitality, nursing and paramedics and Construction and other industries and where these trainees are being paid a monthly stipend of Rs 5,000 and an amount of Rs 1000 for travelling. He also mentioned that Government approved that the NSDP be extended to other Sectors including Manufacturing, Financial Services and Logistics.

The Status of SMEs in Mauritius and future growth strategies was the theme of the Rotary Club of Phoenix's meeting on April, 26, 2017 at the Mauritius Gymkhana Club in Vacoas.






9- FELLOWSHIP AT STRIKE CITY BAGATELLE

Mushtaq Namdarkhan joined Rotary in March 2012. He is the President for the Rotary Year 2017-18.

Mushtaq is a barrister practising at the Bar of Mauritius. Since 2012, he joined the leading commercial law firm BLC Robert & Associates where he is now a Senior Associate. His practice extends to all forms of commercial dispute resolution (expert determination, mediation, arbitration and court litigation), as well as advising creditors, companies and insolvency practitioners on all aspects of corporate restructurings and insolvency law.

Mushtaq is 34 years old. After completing his secondary school studies at the Royal College of Port-Louis and winning a State Scholarship, he pursued his law degree at the University of Cambridge from which he graduated with a First Class MA(Hons) in Law in 2004. He studied for his Bar Vocational Course at Nottingham Law School and was called to the Bar of England and Wales at the Honourable Society of Gray's Inn in November 2015. He returned to the University of Cambridge to complete a Masters Degree in Law in 2005-2006.

After completing his pupillage in Mauritius under the supervision of Mr Désiré Basset, Senior Counsel and the late Mr Guy Rivalland, Senior Attorney, Mushtaq was sworn in as a barrister of the Republic of Mauritius in January 2008, becoming the

(then) third member of his family to be admitted to the Mauritian Bar.

Between 2008 and 2012, he pursued an international career by working at a major international law firm in London, Herbert Smith LLP. He spent time in their Equity Capital Markets, Mergers & Acquisitions, Restructuring and Insolvency, Construction Litigation and Tax Departments before being admitted, in March 2010, to the roll of solicitors of England and Wales and qualifying as an associate in the Restructuring and Insolvency team.

Since March 2015, he has been an independent member of the Monetary Policy Committee of the Bank of Mauritius. He also occasionally teaches contract law at the Institute of Judicial and Legal Studies.

Outside of work, Mushtaq is an active member of the Rotary Club of Phoenix, which he joined upon his return to Mauritius in March 2012. He has held various posts since that time, namely member of the Community Service committee, Treasurer, Secretary and President-Elect and Director of Foundation.

Mushtaq enjoys reading, in particular about world history. He is a keen follower of Formula One and English Football, and is a firm supporter of Ferrari and Arsenal FC. When there is time, he undertakes nature walks.
