

18 ans à croire et à investir dans la 'Jeune Génération' avec la création de nos Clubs Rotaract et Interact.





During the party given to conclude the said project, random participants were asked to give their feedback. Our Charter member Jean Claude Nubbo asked the gentleman what motivated him to join the group and attend all the talks, to which he very candidly replied: "Mo ti envie koné ki éna dan lékor sa banne madame la ki fer zot manze nou la vie gramatin tanto".



With globalisation, the business sector all around, it has also made inroads in social service sector. This was recently proved as Rotarians from Thane club, along with their wife, Dr. Anand Kale, conducted squint corrective surgeries on 28 children. So happy were the hospital authorities that they accorded a warm felicitation to the Rotarians from India.

The Rotary club of Phoenix had approached the Rotary club of Thane under the Global Grant scheme. Rotary clubs spread over 112 countries across the globe carry out humanitarian projects. Under this programme, a Rotary club from the remotest place in an under developed country gets a helping hand from countries better off than them. Rotarians give their valuable time and money as well as execute the projects ranging from health to sanitation and education to environment.

P'TITE MAIN VERTE



Ce projet a pour but de sensibiliser les enfants sur l'importance de l'autosuffisance alimentaire à travers la création d'un jardin scolaire. La conception du projet a commencé pendant le confinement où tout le monde avait pris conscience de l'importance d'être autosuffisant et, surtout, de produire ce que l'on mange.

Nous avons choisi de travailler avec l'école H. Chooroomoney, avec laquelle nous avons eu l'occasion de travailler par le passé, notamment avec les enfants du « Special Education Needs (SEN) Unit » du même établissement.

Le Rotary Club de Phoenix a créé un jardin scolaire dans l'enceinte de l'école avec pour objectif d'encourager les enfants à s'intéresser à la terre et apprendre les techniques de jardinage. Le jardin est composé principalement de matériaux recyclés comprenant bacs en plastique et palettes en bois. Les bacs contiennent plusieurs types de légumes et de plantes aromatiques, médicinales et décoratives. On n'utilise ni pesticides ni herbicides.

Date:

Septembre 2020 - juin 2021

Le projet comprend également la mise en place d'un système de compostage et de collecte d'eau de pluie dans le cadre d'une sensibilisation aux pratiques de jardinage durable.

Il est à noter que la protection de l'environnement fait partie des axes stratégiques du Rotary International.

Ce projet a été rendu possible grâce au support technique de la FAREI et au soutien de l'Ambassade des Etats Unis à travers l'Ambassador Self Help Program et d'autres sponsors.

Le deuxième volet du projet consiste à encourager ces enfants à avoir un jardin potager chez eux où ils pourront continuer ce qu'ils ont appris à l'école. Des bacs, de la terre, des semences et des plantes seront fournis aux familles sélectionnées.

Le dernier volet consistera à la publication d'un guide électronique avec pour but de rendre plus accessible et d'encourager le public à s'intéresser au jardinage.

JOURNÉE MONDIALE CONTRE LA POLIO – END POLIO NOW

Un jour. Un objectif. En finir avec la polio.

Lancé en 1985, le programme mondial pour éradiquer la polio est un des objectifs phares du Rotary International. Grâce à la vaccination, nous y sommes presque. Le 25 août 2020, l'OMS déclarait enfin la région Afrique débarrassée du poliovirus sauvage. Mais le virus rôde toujours, en Afghanistan et au Pakistan, et il nous faut rester plus que jamais mobilisés.

Pour soutenir cette lutte et conscientiser, les Clubs rotariens de l'île ont participé ensemble à une opération d'envergure : construire le plus grand End Polio Now sur l'esplanade du Port Louis Waterfront avec des boîtes en carton.

Aussi, les membres du Club, la famille, les membres du Rotaract de Phoenix, les amis - tous ont mis la main à la... peinture pour «Amen to bwat». Un crowdfunding a aussi été organisé pour lever des fonds destinés à la lutte contre la polio et les boîtes utilisées pour cette opération recyclées.

I joined Interact with hopes of not only giving back to the community to the best of my ability, but also bringing students like me, into this journey of discovering new facets of life.



As I look back on 2020, I reflect on how our lives have changed. The global COVID-19 pandemic brought pain and loss to many of us. And for almost all of us, our daily lives, family time, and work also changed this year. But we've made it to the end of this difficult year, not on our own but by reaching out to one another, as we always do in Rotary. With each passing year, I become prouder of our organization.

I will choose to remember 2020 as a year of great change and strength for us; Rotary didn't stop, despite the pandemic. We removed obstacles, found new ways to connect, and embraced new approaches to service, such as online projects and virtual fundraising. I have invited two Rotarians to share their stories about how Rotary grew stronger this year.

When the pandemic shut everything down, our emerging e-club was already providing digital service, including internationally. Fourteen U.S. women and I, members of multiple Rotary clubs, were using WhatsApp to mentor women entrepreneurs in rural Costa Rica, helping them to grow their ecotourism business, RETUS Tours [the subject of the magazine's May cover story, "Nature & Nurture"]. The project has grown, with 30 Rotarians now providing consulting and help with the RETUS website and social media. Most importantly, we continue building relationships and empowering these women to transform their own lives, and we are doing it online. I've even helped one of the women, Rosa, prepare a presentation in English for an online international conference. While our engagement with the Costa Rican women still requires some hands-on activity, the most transformative impacts haven't had to be in person.

I was president of my club when COVID-19 hit, and many members didn't yet have Zoom. Only 10 of our 53 members participated in the first Zoom meeting during the pandemic. I thought that reaching out and getting guest speakers from around the world to engage our members would help. Many Rotary leaders, a Rotary Peace Fellow, and even RI President Holger Knaack visited virtually and spoke to our club. Meeting attendance improved, while we reduced running costs by cutting out meals. Some members who worked outside our city and had missed our meetings even rejoined us. Registering our online meetings on My Rotary enhanced contacts with clubs across the world, and the joint meeting addressed by Holger attracted more than 300 visitors. We also raised more funds as members and visitors contributed to our projects. To continue being flexible for all, we are now offering hybrid meetings. For me, 2020 has been the best year in Rotary as I've made many new friends.

THE PRESIDENTIAL THEME 2021-2022: SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES

Incoming Rotary International President Shekhar Mehta urged members to become more involved in service projects, saying that caring for and serving others is the best way to live because it changes not only other people's lives, but also our own.

Mehta, a member of the Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, West Bengal, India, revealed the 2021-22 presidential theme, Serve to Change Lives, to incoming district governors on 1 February during the Rotary International Assembly. The assembly, a yearly training event for district governors-elect, was originally set to take place in Orlando, Florida, USA, but was held virtually because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mehta spoke about how participating in service projects through Rotary changed him as a person and made him empathize more with the needs of others. Soon after joining his club, he helped carry out projects that benefited rural communities in India.

Some of the poor conditions he saw in those communities strengthened his commitment to service.
“I truly understood the plight of my brethren,” he said.

Mehta participated in initiatives that brought artificial limbs to children, clean water and sanitation to homes, and better health care facilities to communities.

“Rotary kindled the spark within me to look beyond myself and embrace humanity,” he said. “Service became a way of life for me and I, like many others, adopted the guiding philosophy that ‘Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on this earth, and I want to be a good tenant of this earth.’”


