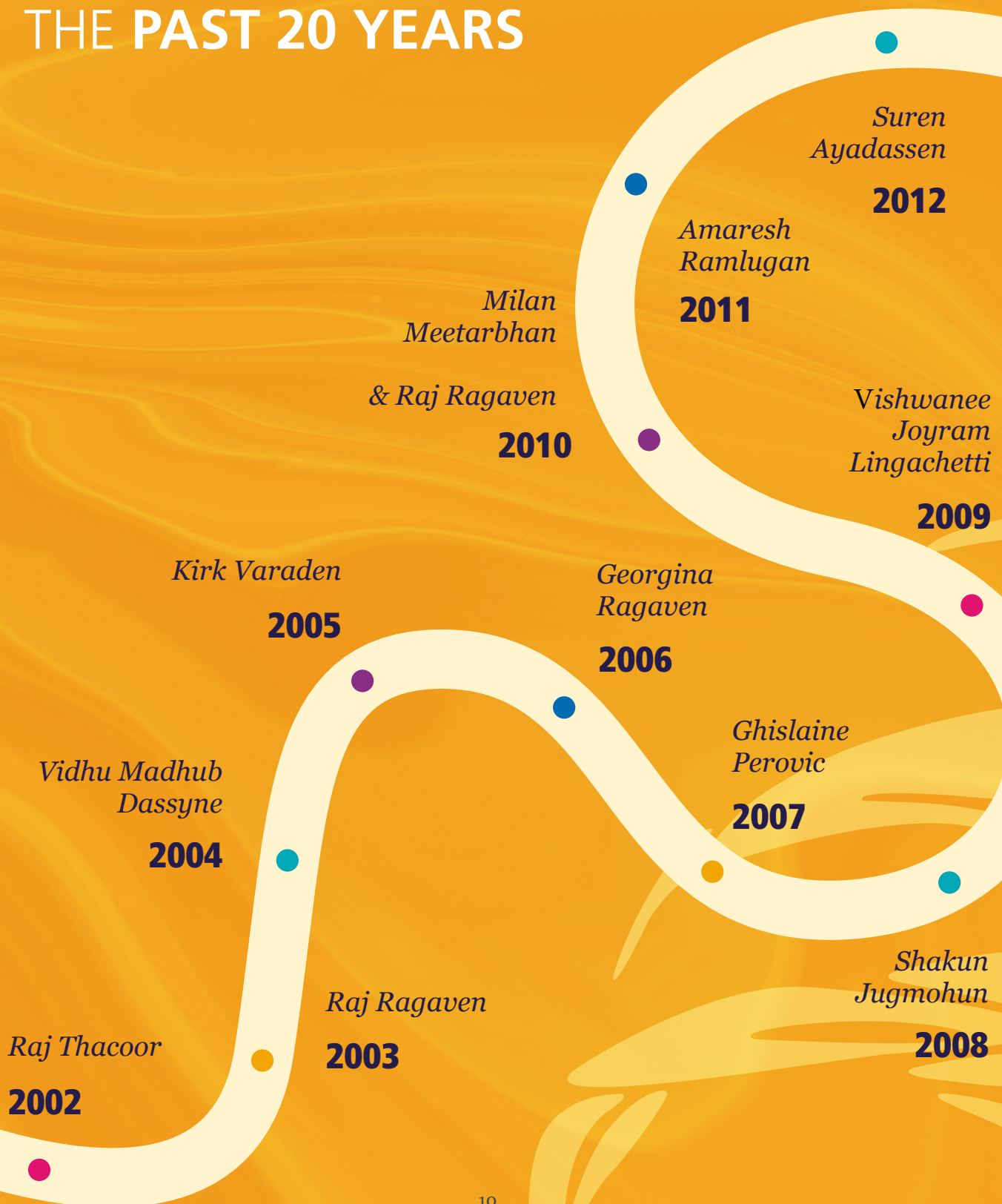

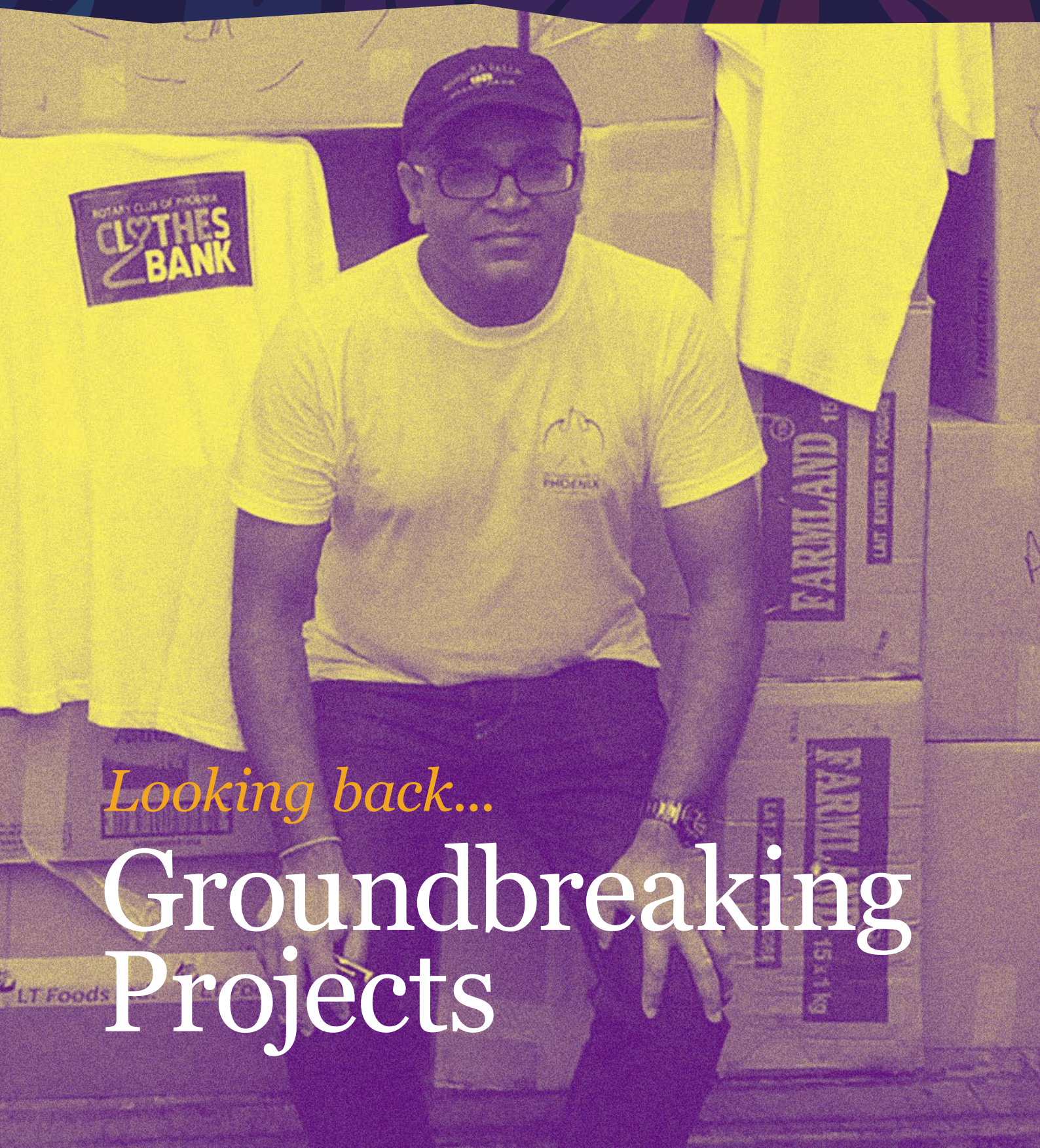

Furnishing of the center, which included white boards, tables and chairs, filing cabinets, computer tables, VCD player, PC and printer.

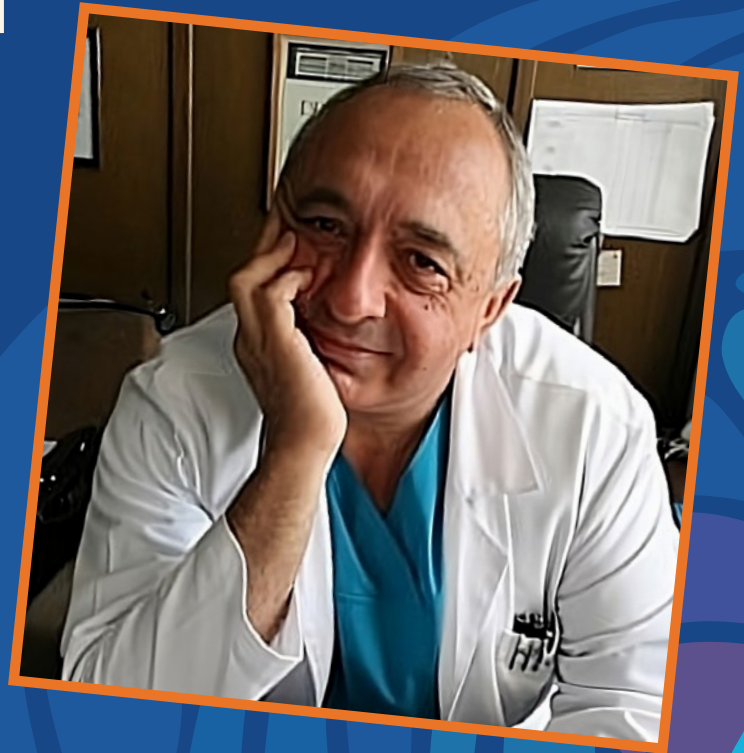

The Physically Handicapped Welfare Association, PHWA in Rose-Hill has a special bond with the Rotary Club of Phoenix.

The club has been supporting the association for more than ten years now. Lunch and medical check-ups are regular features during Polio Day, which is observed every 24th October.

As part of the club's ongoing contribution, a water filter was donated to the members of the association, which has some 40 people, among them 6 who have been affected by polio.

This year, wheelchairs and walking aids were donated to the association in Rose-Hill.

This project called on all companies to design original Christmas trees, whereby more than 30 responded positively.

# SAFIRE PROJECT

Providing water, sanitation and hygiene is one of the 7 pillars of service of Rotary. For a period of one year from November 2017 to October 2018, 130 children were given health kits in a bid to encourage hygiene.

It was funded from District Grant and Essar Group. The project kicked off with the handing over to 300 children at the Pamlemousses Youth Centre.

These children are followed up by the Non-Governmental Organisation, SAFIRE - Service d'Accompagnement, de Formation, d' Insertion et Rehabilitation de l' Enfant. The total cost of the project was MUR 208, 000.

More than 600 sanitary kits for a period of 12 consecutive months were distributed to the children of SAFIRE.



# ATRAP DELO PAS LAISS LI ALLE

50 low-income families from Rodrigues benefitted from water tanks to collect rain water, Atrap Delo pa laiss li alle Project.

The region targeted were Petite Butte, Mont Limon and neighbouring areas. Phase 1 kicked off in October 2018, whereby 20 water tanks were distributed and installed in the area of Petite Butte.

Phase 2 was carried out in March 2019, where the remaining 30 water tanks were handed over.

The cost of Atrap Delo pas laisse li alle was to the tune of MUR 750,000.

In a bid to create awareness on saving water, the club also launched the 'Let's Celebrate Water' painting contest for upper primary and lower secondary students in Rodrigues. The contest was a huge success as 42 students participated at elementary level and 35 at college level.



# UNITED NATIONS DAY 2019

The Rotary Club of Phoenix which has a long history of celebrating the United Nations Day, hosted a seminar jointly with the United Nations Country Team for Mauritius and Seychelles, and the University of Mauritius.

Distinguished guests, academics and students attended the event which was held at the Octave-Wiehe Auditorium at Réduit.

The then United Nations Resident Coordinator for Mauritius, Christine Umutoni was also present.

Three interactive panel discussions were on the agenda:

1. "The United Nations and the post-war order",
2. "The United Nations and the Sustainable Development Goals"
3. "The United Nations and Climate Change".

High calibre panelists animated each session and more than 420 people registered for the seminar.

The Rotary Club of Phoenix conceptualised and ran 'La Natir Nouri Nou' Children Painting Contest in June 2020.

This was done post the first Covid-19 confinement where the Club aimed to Celebrate Plants Through Art and thus sensitising children about the importance of plants and the need to grow your own at home.

The Painting Contest was open to Children and broken down into 2 categories:  
Category A: children aged 8 - 11 years  
Category B: children aged 12 - 18 years.

We received 173 creative and inspiring paintings from children across the island. This contest was run purely online.

An award ceremony was held at Imaaya Art Gallery, Phoenix in August 2020 to reward the top 3 paintings per category.

A special jury award was also given to 4 children in each category.

# P'TITE MAIN VERTE - SCIENCE CLASS

## CHOROMONEY GOVERNMENT SCHOOL

The Rotary Club of Phoenix took the Chooromoney Government School in Bassin, Quatre Bornes, under its wings. The P'tite Main Verte Project was launched in a bid to encourage some 80 students of the school in gardening.

The project benefitted from the aid of the Ambassador's Special Self Help Program by the United States Embassy, the Food and Agricultural Research & Extension Institute as well as other sponsors.

An initiative aimed to promote food self-sufficiency at the cost of MUR 180, 000.

The Science Class is another inspiring project done by the Rotary Club of Phoenix at the school. The refurbishment and design of the new science class cost was MUR 200, 000.

The project aimed to encourage children in discovering and loving science through the use of adequate equipment, learning materials and posters.

School bags and stationaries were also donated to some 250 students of the school at a cost of MUR 180,000.

The club also came in support to provide yogurt to all school children on a weekly basis for one year to promote a balanced diet.

The Squint Project, a major project of the Rotary Club of Phoenix, which saw Phase 1 launched in May 2019 and Phase 2 conducted in April 2022.

The Club stepped up to help the Subramania Bharathi Government Hospital in Moka, Mauritius to clear their backlog of surgeries and specialist consultation for SQUINT problems in children.

Through the initiative of the Club, in partnership with Rotary Club of Thane, India, Dr. Atul Seth and Dr. Siddharth Kesarwari, specialists from India, made the trip to Mauritius on both occasions. The aim of these visits was to demystify strabismus, to examine children who were affected by it, and to share their know-how with Mauritian doctors.

Our young friends embarked on projects relating to environment and the right to water.



## MANGROVES



The Rotaract Club of Phoenix put in place a project to raise awareness on mangroves and wetlands.

Planting seedlings was one of the main actions carried out.

The Rotaractors have worked closely with Reef Conservation in a bid to encourage in preserving our coastlines.

## RAINWATER HARVESTING

The Rotaract Club of Phoenix and Le Lycée Mauricien have teamed up to establish a Rainwater Harvesting system in response to Mauritius's water shortage and outages.

Consequently, the school will be less dependent on the Central Water Authority.

They have been using it for cleaning as well as in their vegetable garden.

Through this project, the club hopes to raise awareness of the limited supply of fresh water and the need to look for practical alternatives, such collecting rainwater for daily use.



## SDF PROJECT-HELPING HANDS



While many people spent Christmas well-surrounded by their loved ones, others spent the holiday alone and without a roof over their heads or a nutritious supper.

A dinner and backpack kit consisting of a blanket, a raincoat, and a reusable water bottle were given to a group of homeless people by the Rotaract club of Phoenix with assistance from the Rotaract club of Port Louis.

These donations were made to more than 50 homeless people.

# INTERACT CLUB OF COLLEGE DU ST ESPRIT

April 22, 2021, we witnessed an evening filled with emotions for around 30 young gentlemen from St Esprit College.

In keeping with the spirit and goals of the Rotary, these students aim to become People of Action and acquire new skills by opening up to the world and meeting new friends while discovering the importance of service to the community, thus joining, on that day, the great Rotarian family and the approximately 342,000 Interactors around the world.

# SENSITISATION CAMPAIGN

## ON THE IMPORTANCE OF WEARING SUNGLASSES BY FISHERMEN

2021-2022

The Rotary Club of Phoenix partnered with ENL Group on a project that aimed at sensitizing the need to wear sunglasses and distributing sunglasses to fishermen around the island. (August – September 2021)

### Issue

Eye Protection against UV Light is essential in our daily lives. Fishermen are among those who are the most exposed at work and require protection such that they do not develop eye pathologies.





## Project Scope

- Production of sunglasses frames (mounted by appropriate glasses providing UV protection) by Platinax using recycled plastic bottles.
- Sensitisation campaign by the Rotary Club of Phoenix in order to highlight the importance of wearing glasses
- Distribution of these sunglasses by ENL Group among 1,850 fishermen over the island during 4 Sunday sessions.

## Project Phases

1. A clean up (half Day) session on the beach with all the stakeholders (GRSE proposed by ENL)
2. Sensitisation campaign on the importance of wearing sunglasses to fishermen.
3. Distribution of Sunglasses to fishermen

## Role of The Rotary Club of Phoenix

- To provide the medical information related to eyesight protection against UV light by our medical/Rotarian team.
- Help with the distribution of sunglasses
- The project revolved around two main areas of focus of RI, i.e. Disease Prevention & Treatment as well as Environment Protection.
